Martin Graff is an artist, author, musician, and extreme-chin-beard enthusiast in Arlington, Virginia who crafts poetic vignettes with matching art on every topic from the stigma of liking scrapple to the meaning of life in a series called *The Face Zone:* Surreal Daydreams to Trip Your Imagination... Marty's live spoken-word show adds original piano compositions from his album Trips for Piano to heighten the experience.

"It started in childhood. To amuse the five-year-old me, my father drew a face on the inside bottom of a large water thermos that he used for tennis. When you looked into the empty container, you could see a deep, swollen, horizontal slit at the end where the halves of the plastic mold came together. With a long pencil, Dad drew two black circles above the slit, now a 'mouth,' and my imagination was triggered: the resulting expression was weird, cute, and mildly foreboding all at once. That simple, neutral water bottle became a sentient oddity for which to compose a fantastical backstory. I've been at it ever since, finding unexpected narratives and messages in the ordinary details around me."

Graff's affecting commentary, original humor, whimsical artwork, and absorbing piano offer a uniquely engaging respite that cuts through the noise of our information-age lives with concise, essential truths certain to entertain as they set mind in motion.

Martin Graff is an illustrator, author and composer who has created this heartfelt work based on his travels and life and musings about how humans connect with one another. He uses his own life to riff on how we interact with the world and how our perceptions change.

'The Face Zone' is an earnest, humorous look at one man's travels to a wider world.

Using a keyboard, simple, barely-delineated sketches and a soothing voice to tantalize the audience with faces and pictures representing his different thoughts, he guides the audience through a series of vignettes ranging from an idyllic hour spent on a deserted beach in Hong Kong to how his beard helped him connect with school children he was teaching to working in an office in Asia and how food choices can be a minefield of preconceived ideas about society.

Through his musings, he comes to the realization that so much of our personal values and beliefs are a product of the larger society—an idea that has been explored before—but in his hands, he underscores the importance of looking within to find out why we react as we do in different settings, and then urges the audience to make the jump to giving that grace to all we meet.

In this deeply personal study of his on-going journey, Graff offers a path to recognizing how our internal monologues affect our perceptions, and how to step back and ask, why? Is it valid? Is it relevant? Is it keeping us from fully experiencing our lives?

His compositions are soothing and serve as a means to give the audience a chance to reflect on his vignettes. The illustrations are cunningly child-like, meant to serve as a stepping-off point to go deeper without using color and line and scale as an unconscious means to set limits on how far one is willing to explore.

"The Face Zone" is an earnest, humorous look at one man's travels to a wider world. He strives to treat all he meets gently and to be forgiving of each other as we strive to make connections and move liquidly through the greater world.

Running Time: 45 minutes with no intermission.

"The Face Zone" is at Crocodile, Saint Augustine's Episcopal Church, Washington, DC, and shows are July 17, July 26 and July 27.

Capital Fringe Review: The Face Zone, Surreal Daydreams to Trip Your Imagination

Upbeat and whimsical, The Face Zone meanders between philosophical musings and autobiographical tales in a Sark-esque combination of drawings and poetry. Bopping from thought to thought, Martin Graff's one-man show is like going to a jam-packed party where you brush up against a lot of eclectic folks, but you don't get fully introduced to any of them.



Graff showcases his range of artistic endeavors in The Face Zone, which include poetry, drawing, and music. He combines his spoken word performance with projections of his visual art, and frames these segments by playing his piano compositions.

The show is like an illustrated book of his freewheeling psyche and, as its affable author, Graff flips through the pages and points out his favorite parts. His poetry encompasses a range of topics from the stress of hunting for parking spaces in strip malls and a meditative moment on a beach near Hong Kong to his formidable chin beard giving him cred at a tough biker gathering. Graff offers up an abundance of ideas in his reveries on living and uses his fanciful drawings as the jumping-off point for each new stream of thoughts.

While each artistic dimension of the show has compelling facets, I would have liked to see a fuller interlacing of the words, images, and music. The moments in the performance when Graff's images and poetry play off each other in humorous or clever ways demonstrates what he can do, but also draws attention to the times when there is less of a strong connection between the two. The piano interludes help to give the show structure, but since they are distinctly separate from the poetry and image sections, they end up feeling tonally detached.

Graff keeps the pacing moving, so even if one poem doesn't quite connect, he is soon on to a new one. The show is brief, but the length works with this collection of short poems. Even with the sometimes heady subject matter, Graff's peppering of humorous observations and quirky bits throughout the show keeps things fizzing.


The Face Zone is a fanciful show that takes you on a whirlwind tour through Graff's perspectives on the meaning of life. His world seems crammed with a kaleidoscopic swirl of thoughts, feelings, and experiences that are interesting to get a peek into, even if a peek is all you get.

Sunday, May 15, 2016 The Face Zone, Live at Artomatic 2016, Featuring Martin Graff By Steve Loya

A couple of years ago I had the good fortune of finding out about local visual and performance artist, wordsmith, musician, and teacher, Martin Graff, and his extraordinary ongoing project known as The Face Zone. It was at a cartoonists and comics art exhibit in downtown Frederick, Maryland that I noticed a wall full of curious little minimalistic illustrations of strange and interesting faces, accompanied by some words. The cartoonish faces depicted things like melting cheese on a pizza and titles like "Melting Cheese Pain," paired with thoughtful musings on the dark side of personification. The words and images were brilliant and unique observations on everyday life, in some ways like a punk rock Jerry Seinfeld with a Banksy-like sensibility.

Soon after, Marty, as most folks know him, had a big exhibit of his work again in downtown Frederick, and I ended up purchasing his self-published Face Zone book, which compiled many of his words and illustrations. Marty describes his Face Zone series as "short visual meditations on what makes the world go round. Existential musings with a surreal twist and a dark sense of humor sure to trip your imagination..."

Last night, Frederick Artomatic hosted one of Marty's live Face Zone events, taking those short, visual meditations one step further into the realm of spoken-word and performance art. As someone who has struggled personally with speaking in front of one's peers, it always amazes me when someone seems to effortlessly get up in front of an audience of people to talk, act, sing, or dance. I'm even more amazed when someone can remember their lines or the words they want to express to an audience without forgetting. While Marty's performance, based on his illustrated and written Face Zone material, seemed like second-nature for him, there's no doubt the amount of time, energy, and preparation condensed into a single half-an-hour show was anything but effortless.

Seeing and hearing Marty expand and further elaborate upon the words and images in his book added yet another crucial dimension to The Face Zone experience and, according to Marty, is ultimately the core of what he does now the book more or less a companion to his spoken-word shows. As someone who experienced both the art exhibits and book aspect of The Face Zone first. I found the spoken-word performance to delve much deeper and further into these musings on subject matter ranging from the relativity of the food we eat ("Today's Special") to haunting childhood memories of how choking on a single lemon drop soured a young boy's perception of the ocean off the Jersey shore ("Twinkles in The Sea"). One of my personal favorites was Marty's take on the absurdity of commercial advertising, with its irrational fairy-tale promises and the less-than-satisfying results ("Jolly Hot Peanuts"), which he began last night's performance with. However, despite the dark humor and keenly cynical observations of The Face Zone live, there was a glowingly optimistic underlying message of hope and a love of life at the very core of it all.

The ability to hold an audience captive for extended periods of time as a one-man spoken word act is by no means an easy task, and in some ways Marty's musings and highly engaging observations on the world in which we live, relayed through the medium of speech and told through the lens of personal experience, reminded me of some of the best performances from Henry Rollins, who I've seen speak live on several occasions over the past two decades. Word has it there may even be a musical element added to The Face Zone live experience in the not-too-distant future. Whatever the case, don't hesitate to witness Marty's live act if he comes to a venue near you. In the meantime, TED Talks should seriously consider inviting Marty to do his thing for them someday soon!
